Erik joined the Rotary Club of Foothill-Highlands on August 1, 1967 and was loaned the classification Travel Agent. He served as the Club's President during the 1990-91 Rotary year. In addition, he held the position of Vice President, Co-Chair of our Bingo Fundraiser as well as serving as Chair of our Entertainment Books Fundraiser.

Erik had been a Rotarian for 48 years when he resigned from Rotary in 2015 due to health issues. He was a strong supporter of The Rotary Foundation—he was a Paul Harris Fellow +7 and a Rotary Foundation Benefactor.

Erik passed away on Friday, December 9th after a courageous battle with Alzheimer's.
