


RECOGNITIONS

nationally and internationally for its innovative energy efficiency programs and renewable power technologies, SMUD was the first large California utility to receive more than 20 percent of its energy from renewable resources

Time-of-Day (5-8 p.m.) Rate

This rate will become the standard rate for all residential customers in 2019. Some customers will transition to the rate as early as October 2018, with most customers transitioning in early 2019.

What is Time-of-Day?

On the Time-of-Day Rate, you pay different rates for electricity based on the season and the time of day that you use it.

Rates are lower during off-peak periods because it costs us less to produce or purchase electricity. Rates increase as demand and cost for electricity increase, especially during the summer months.

TOD rates help you control your electric bill when you:

•Shift your electricity use to lower-cost offpeak times

•Use less electricity during the 5-8 p.m. peak hours

•Reduce your overall usage

It's important to conserve during peak hours

Time of Day pricing is here

- On the TOD rate, when you use electricity is just as important as the amount of electricity you use. You pay different rates for electricity based on the time of day you use it.
- It also gives you flexibility and control of your electric bill by shifting electricity to off-peak hours, using less during peak hours and reducing electricity usage overall.



Helping local businesses thrive.

SMUD is participating in a program designed to enable local community banks to provide loans to local businesses with the goal of economic growth and business expansion.

SMUD has made three deposits of \$5 million each to Five Star Bank, River City Bank and American River Bank. The three banks are part of the Responsible Investments for a Stronger Economy program, also known as RISE, which encourages local agencies like SMUD and others to make deposits in community banks that can provide much needed capital and improvement loans. The banks will loan at least 50 percent of the funds in the SMUD service area to qualified applicants and will provide reports to SMUD on the loans made and projected number of jobs created.
