



HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Our speaker was **Jim Quinney.** He was born and raised in Jacksonville, Florida, is married to Amy and they have two grown daughters. **Jim** has owned or co-owned several small insurance agencies and retired from the insurance business after 34 years. **Jim** and Amy moved to Rocklin in 2003 and now live in Lincoln.

During the past six years, Jim has been involved with a number of global and local outreach programs, including Living Water International, Rise Against Hunger, Lighting for Literacy, St. Luc School in Haiti, and the Gathering Inn. He was recently asked to become the Community Engagement Manager for Rise Against Hunger in Sacramento. Jim looks forward to doing something he is truly passionate about every day, helping people transform their lives both here and abroad.

VENEZUELA REGIONAL CRISIS

Since 2014, the Bolivarian Republic of deteriorating Venezuela has seen economic and political conditions. As these conditions continue to worsen, the country is seeing a record number of people fleeing. More than 3 million people have left since 2014, and currently, up to 40,000 migrants cross the Colombian border daily in search of staples like medicine, vegetables and eggs. Many Venezuelans stay in the border town of Cucuta, Colombia. Rise Against Hunger meals help support the influx of need in 10 distribution centers throughout the city.

Many migrants are fleeing to neighboring countries on foot, often walking over 900 miles to neighboring countries such as Peru and Ecuador in hopes of finding work. While carrying all their possessions, these migrants are reliant on the network of distribution centers along the route to eat one hot meal a day. Rise Against Hunger meals are in four of these distribution centers, along with our partner organizations, Rotary Club of Cucuta and e-Rotary Club of Houston, supporting the work of the local grassroots movement by providing nutrient dense, hot meals. In addition, Rise Against Hunger is providing access to complementary proteins and vegetables.

Rise Against Hunger's current relief effort was scheduled to end on March 31. However, after visiting distribution sites, it is clear the need is still urgent and ongoing. To meet the needs of approximately 5,400 individuals daily, that are directly affected by the crisis in Venezuela, Rise Against Hunger will need to invest \$65,000 through the end of May. Our plan is an on-the-ground approach with a strategic partnership with a network of Rotary Clubs to continue feeding migrants in emergency temporary shelters, housing, displacement camps, and community kitchens. With our partners, we will also aim encourage local to procurement for complementary foods and our meals.
