District Human Trafficking Prevention Project

Dear Rotary District 5180 Rotarians,

February 9, 2020

It has been almost a year since we last communicated with you on our human trafficking global grant that was started in 2016. As a recap, this project was the largest Rotary Foundation global grant in the U.S., and the largest human trafficking grant in the World1 The global grant application process started in January 2016 and was approved by RI in November 2017. The project has been comprised of two components: a public awareness campaign and prevention education in our schools. We designed the project with the belief that it could be replicated throughout the Rotary world. We are now very close to completion.

Over the past 2 years we have been able to educate over 51,000 students and over 850 school staff in schools in District 5180. Our goal was to be able to have trainings in every school district in our Rotary district. We can truthfully say that we have brought the Protect program to every school that had an interest, at no cost to the schools, through the usage of Rotary grant funds. However, we do not have enough funds to educate every student in every school. We also do not have funding to continue the program after the grant funds have been used. Our intent has always been to use this grant to put a stake in the ground and show the world what positive benefits can be obtained by creating a best practices program that can be replicated globally. We have done that.

A secondary goal and benefit of the grant was to build relationships with not only local non-profits and agencies that do work to stop human trafficking on a daily basis but those throughout the world. We have done that too! Brian Gladden and I have been speaking constantly to Rotary Clubs and District throughout the United States and around the world. Now it is time for the clubs in our district to use those relationships and create your own local human trafficking projects to benefit those of your choosing. We would hate to see all of this hard work we have put in the past four years to stop.

Here are a number of ways in which your club can help sustain the benefits of our grant, and enhance it by adding your own imprint:

- 1. "Adopt a School": Work directly with a local school/district to fund trafficking education
- Create a district grant for trafficking education or victim services. New District Grants will be available for the 2020-21 Rotary year
- Work directly with nonprofits to fund trafficking or victims services projects
- 4. Leverage interact clubs to further school relationships and fund awareness projects
- 5. Engage local PR firms to create a public awareness campaign for your community

An example of what you can do is what Angela Spease and the Rotary Club of Laguna Sunrise have done. They created their own district grant to educate the Elk Grove community, by funding billboards and implementing community education and training events.
