

HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

IPP **Patrick Magnani** introduced our speaker **Joe Wagoner**, Executive Vice President of the Sacramento Republic FC. **Joe** manages the daily business operations of Sacramento Republic FC. Over the past 17 seasons in professional sports, he has led teams that have delivered seven national attendance records, as well as ten organizational revenue and ticket sales records.

During his career with professional sports, **Joe** has lead two professional sports organization start-ups, three organizational restructuring efforts and three stadium renovations. **Joe** began his career at J. Walter Thompson Advertising in Chicago, IL as an account executive on the national Kraft Foods and Dell Computer advertising accounts. He attended Midland College (Fremont, NE) and is a native of Macomb, IL.

Joe began by explaining how the brand was designed.

They received 6,000 suggestions for the name, crest shape and color.

The brand includes a star representing Sacramento as the State Capitol, the Bear from the State flag and "Urbs Indomita." Upon its settlement, Sacramento, CA was given the nickname "Urbs Indomita" (The Indomitable City) because its citizens were not easily subdued. The city's early settlers did not surrender to the natural disasters or disease that plagued the region in which they desired to thrive, literally moving the American River – and raising their city above it – to create a viable community.



Bonney Field

Constructed in 2014, Bonney Field is the official home pitch of Sacramento Republic FC. Nestled on the grounds of Cal Expo, Bonney Field is one of the largest professional soccer pitches in the United States. The facility seats approximately 8,000 providing an intimate experience for the Sacramento region's soccer fans.

Construction of the field began in March 2014. In April 2014, Republic FC announced a multi-year naming rights partnership with Bonney Plumbing, Heating & Air to name the facility, Bonney Field. The approximately \$3 million privately funded facility is a private-public collaboration among Ovations Food Service, Republic FC and Cal Expo.
