

Mountain Manor offers a variety of activities for its residents allowing them to maintain healthy lifestyles by encouraging movement and socializing with their peers. Being able to interact with other residents is an integral part of keeping residents active and engaged.

Jim said he is personally involved in each new admission and reviews care plans with his head of Nursing Administration.

If one could sum up **Jim's** philosophy about Mountain Manor, it would be to say it's the next best place to being at home.


