HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

President Elect **Marilee Monagan** introduced **Rich Desmond. Rich** is a fifth generation Sacramento County resident, born and raised and lives in Carmichael. He graduated from Jesuit High School and Santa Clara University with a BA degree in English. He graduated from McGeorge School of Law in May of 2000 and passed the California Bar Exam in July of that year.

He has been a member of the California Highway Patrol since 1995, having served as patrol officer and sergeant in his early years. In 2018, he was assigned to the California State Assembly as the Chief Sergeant-at-

Arms. **Rich** participated in the CHP's creation of an AMBER Alert System to locate abducted and missing children and helped develop the CHP's program to train officers on how to safely resolve encounters with people experiencing a mental health crisis.

He has been active in his community and served several terms as a Commissioner of the County Adult and Aging Commission and helped establish the Sacramento Senior Safehouse to protect seniors at risk of abuse. In

1/3 of the calls to sheriff are from the homeless community.


2nd priority, roadways, streets.


