

HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Today's program was a Club Assembly. It began with a *State of the Club Address* from President **Roland Wright** followed by reports from the club's officers and directors.

President Roland reviewed decisions made at the December and January board meetings.

At its December meeting, the board of directors voted to terminate the memberships of **Gene Long**, **Jr.** and **Gerred Popejoy** for failure to adhere to the club's By-Laws as they pertain to monetary and attendance obligations.

At its January meeting, the board voted to accept the resignation of **Jordan Backhaus** due to conflicting work commitments. It also voted to extend the Leave of Absence of **David Stone** until June 30th to provide him with an opportunity to connect with a Rotary club in his new location. **David** sold his home in Sacramento and moved to Arizona.

With the loss of these four members, we are at a critical juncture in the history of this club and will be devoting time and resources to increase our membership during the remainder of the 2017-18 Rotary year and into the future.

We currently have 16 members and it is our goal to induct 3-5 new members between now and June 30th.

President Roland asked if anyone had questions or comments about his *State of the Club* comments. There being none, he started with the reports.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer **Dominic Mecklenburg** provided an update on the club's finances.

- All January invoices have been mailed.
- RI Dues have been paid. Taxes filed and the club is current with all miscellaneous filings.
- Bell Ringers/Gong Bongers: Seven paid bell ringers and gong bongers. If you gonged the bong for the Rotary Foundation, you need to contact **Marilee Monagan** to arrange payment of this obligation. **Dominic** does not bill for this.
- Balance in Club Accounts: \$8.811.
- Balance in Foundation Acct.: \$16,272.
- Two significantly past due members owe the club \$512 and \$127, respectively. He continues his efforts to resolve this issue.
- Earlier in the day financials were provided to the board of directors in preparation for next week's board meeting.

Secretary's Report: Secretary **Lee Wiggins** reported that we have been averaging 66% for our monthly attendance.

Lee mentioned those members requesting a Leave of Absence must do so in writing to him; and he, in turn, will present the request to the board for consideration.

President Roland then asked each of the Avenue of Service Directors to give updates on their respective areas of responsibility.

Club Service: With the departure of four members, updated Buddy Lists and Weekly Assignment Sheets were distributed.

Club Service Director **Mo McBride** has assumed the task of providing weekly programs. She is getting help from **President Roland**, IPP **Dominic Mecklenburg** and PP **Marilee Monagan.** She asked members if they had suggestions for future programs to let her know.

On **Monday, March 5th,** we will hold a club membership meeting to solicit input from ALL members on ways to attract new people to our club. Membership needs to be EVERYONE'S priority.

Community Service: PE Patrick Magnani reported he is working with the North Highlands Parks and Recreation District to collaborate on a project in our service area. This could provide us with an opportunity to fulfill one of R.I. President Ian Riseley's goals of every Rotary planting a tree during this Rotary year. His contact at the Parks and Recreation District has expressed interest in Rotary.

International Service: PP **Bob Meyer** reported that checks have been sent to Operation

Smile, the Philippine School of Love and Hope, Shelter Box and the Cambodian Well Project.

Vocational Service: PP **Bob Spears** has scheduled the club-level District Speech Contest for next Monday. He expects 4-5 contestants.

With the speech contest behind him, **Bob** will look for opportunities for vocational tours and is working with the Twin Rivers School District to identify a candidate for *Teacher of the Year*.

Youth Services: IPP **Dominic Mecklenburg** has taken on the task of identifying students to attend **RYLA** and file the necessary paperwork with District 5180 to make sure we are in compliance with RYLA guidelines.

All **dictionaries** to be distributed this year have been given to third graders at the identified schools in our service area.

The Rotary Foundation: Rotary Foundation Chair **Marilee Monagan** reported that we are at 71.87% of our goal for donations to PolioPlus.

We continue to encourage all members to donate to the Foundation so we can maintain our status of a 100% Sustaining Member Club as well as an EREY Club.

Membership: There will be a **membership meeting** on **Monday**, **March 6th** at the Lions Gate Hotel during our regular meeting time.

We will distribute our newly revised club brochure and BE MY GUEST cards to members for use in our upcoming outreach program to attract new members. The purpose of this membership meeting is to engage all members in a brainstorming session to gather ideas on ways to attract new members to our club.

Following the Board of Directors reports,

President Roland switched gears and talked about our Night at the Museum fundraiser.

Originally scheduled for April, the date has been changed to Friday, June 8th to allow more time to contact vendors and solicit donations for the silent and live auctions and the widely popular Balloon Pop. On February 26th, we will circulate an assignment sheet and ask that ALL members volunteer to help with at least one task prior to the event and one task during the event.

A new flyer was distributed to those present and will be available at future meetings.

President Roland asked if there were any questions regarding any of the information shared at today's meeting. There being none, he asked everyone to stand, raise their glasses and join him in a toast to *Rotary Around the World*.

The meeting was adjourned.


