Next, **Dominic** was recognized for his 12/31 birthday, another wheel spin for a \$6 fine.

Joe also had a Birthday, celebrated by offering a \$100 donation to R/I. **Joe** was also feeling generous for other reasons and decided to Ring the Bell for \$100 to our club.

END POLIO NOW CAMPAIGN





The children will walk directly from the building exit door right into this play area and return indoors without being exposed to the roadway. Protection bollards will be installed to protect the area from cars. SAFE recycled rubber flooring installed on the hard surfaces will protect the children from falls.

If we can raise sufficient funds, the play set and shade canopy will will give the kids a safe and fun place to play. The church, local families dropping off their children will all benefit from this safe and contained environment.
