Holiday Basket Thank You



Joe Destfino, President North Highlands Little League, reported on their needs.

As far as a field update, they have permits for the fields at Highlands High School and take control of them January 24th. Joe has a meeting this Tuesday at 9am with the maintenance people to see what they can do.

As far as what they need. His board has been working together to come up with an idea of what they will need the most to get started. Obviously, the fields are the most important thing right now and Joe expects to start working on them non-stop starting this coming Saturday. They will be putting in base pegs and pitcher's mounds as well as new home plates. They will also need to make base paths which will require a lot of dirt. If anyone has a resource for the dirt, please contact Joe as soon as possible.

As far as anything beyond the fields, the most important need is simply equipment and apparel. They need a lot of equipment as they have absolutely nothing. This list includes bats, helmets, BASEBALLS, catcher's gear, etc. They will also need equipment to help prep fields .i.e. line chalkers, rakes, hoses, bases, etc.

Joe is new to this starting a league thing and so this is what he can think of that they need right now.

PP **Dominic Mecklenburg** added that the North Highlands Little League is rebuilding from scratch. He asked that everyone look around for any <u>new or used baseball equipment</u>. The league will accept anything, as they're trying to support both players and coaches in this effort to getting baseball reestablished inside our service area. Baseballs are a huge expense for any league, so new or used gear, anything works.
