Ian H.S. Riseley is a chartered accountant and principal of Ian Riseley and Co., a firm he established in 1976. Prior to starting his own firm, he worked in the audit and management consulting divisions of large accounting firms and corporations.

President Riseley has been a member of the boards of both a private and a public school, a member of the Community Advisory Group for the City of Sandringham and president of Beaumaris

Sea Scouts Group. He has been president of Langi-Taan Ski Club as well as honorary auditor or adviser for a number of charitable organizations.

President Riseley's honors include the AusAID Peacebuilder Award from the Australian government in recognition of his work in East Timor, the Medal of the Order of Australia for services to the Australian community and the Regional Service Award for a Polio-Free World from The Rotary Foundation.

A Rotarian since 1978, President **Riseley** has served as treasurer, director, Foundation trustee and member and chair of numerous R.I. and Foundation committees.

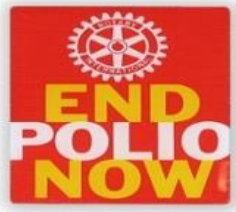

HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

Passport Club President JoAnne Tanner explained the concept behind the formation of the District 5180 eClub a.k.a. Passport Club. In its third year, the Passport defines itself as a civic organization consisting of people who seek to make a difference in their communities by providing volunteerism and financial resources to the Rotary clubs throughout Rotary District 5180. Unlike traditional Rotary Clubs that meet weekly, the Passport Club has four "in-person" meetings per year, sponsors no service projects and performs no fundraising activities. Instead, members are encouraged to attend any of the meetings of any of the other Rotary clubs in the District on days and at times that are convenient for them. Members are also encouraged to support the service projects and fundraising activities of any Club in the District that they find appealing as their schedule permits. The primary objective of membership is making a difference by achieving desired outcomes on demand.

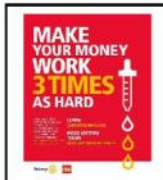

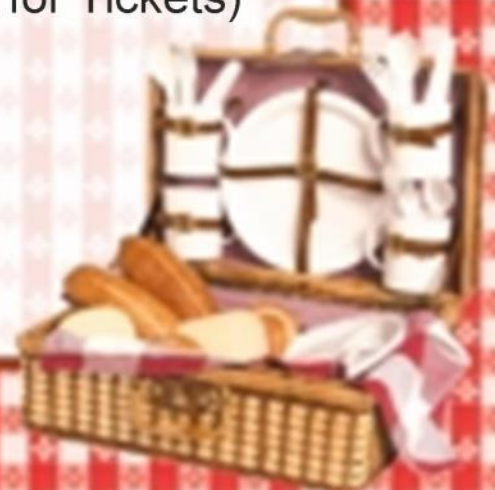

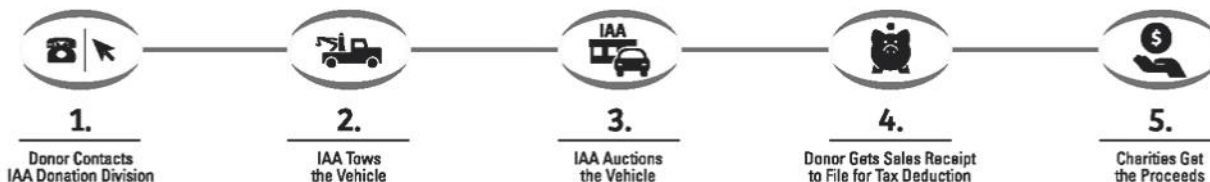
