Jack and Maureen have two children, Isabela and Reagan. Isabela is a Senior at Del Oro High School. She plays volleyball, swims and is in the Interact Club. Reagan is a Freshman at Del Oro High School, occasionally attends Rotary club meetings with his Dad and plays football, rugby and wrestles.


