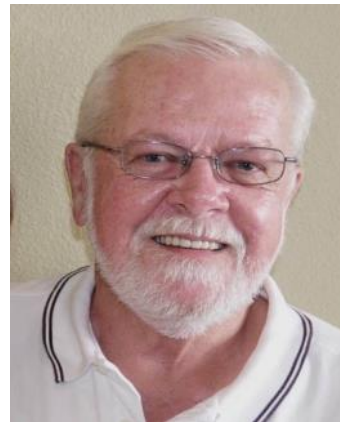

To arrange for a donation, call **Dominic's** cell **916-995-4006**. He will make the arrangements for the pick up.

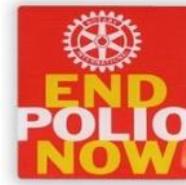


## ANNUAL GIVING/PAUL HARRIS SUSTAINING FELLOWS

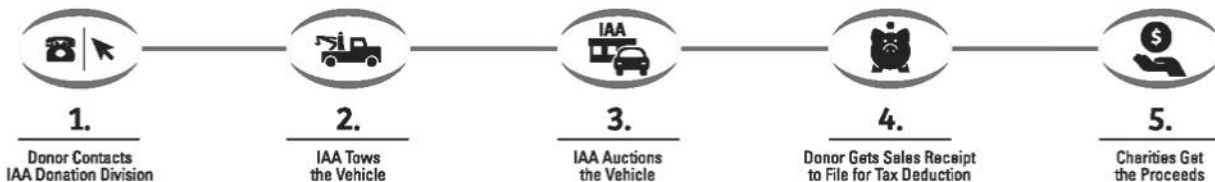
