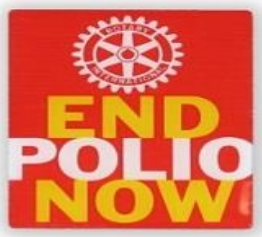

***Dominic Mecklenburg** reports Club finances are strong. We maintain both a club account for operations and a foundation account for our non-profit 501 (c)-3 side of our club. All taxes and regulatory forms have been filed in a timely manner. All club dues have been paid to both the district and Rotary International. We do have 2 club members with outstanding owed balances of more than \$200+ and in excess of 90 days (which suspends TAB privileges). As of 7/24, we have 7 of our 19 club members who still have not paid their DUES for the 1st half of the year, \$102.50 is the minimum amount due by 7/31/17 (or \$205 to pay the year in full). An 8th club member made a partial payment but not the complete \$102.50. We did have challenges with our PO BOX, but we are back on track. 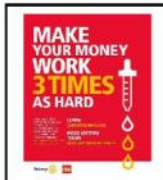

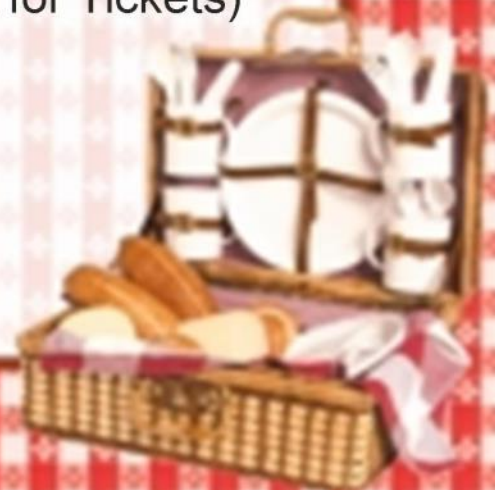

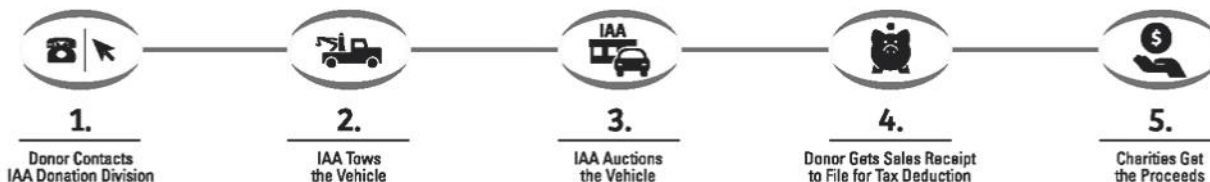
