


When **Al** passed away, he left a generous contribution to TRF for the Polio Plus Program. That contribution was matched by the Gates Foundation.

Next was our Youth Exchange Students (YES) **Armi Cucueco** from the Philippines 1984 and **Jan Loseman** from West Germany.






Donated Video Equipment

Ed Jacobs presented a restored jeep to the Rotary Club of Mexicali-Oriente for rescue work.




Bob Curran and Kerry Hanson deliver our mobile dental unit to the Sacramento Dental Society to provide free oral cancer screenings.


