HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

President Patrick presented a program on making sense of investing. The following is a portion of the information he shared.

Over the past decade, U.S. large-cap stocks (as measured by the S&P 500) have been one of the best-performing investments, returning more than 400% since March compared with international 2009, developed-market (EAFE) returns of 200% and emerging-market (EM) equity returns of 193%. As a result, investors have been inclined to keep their portfolios close to However, history shows home. that performance rotates: Following past times when they've lagged, international developed-market stocks have outperformed U.S. large-cap stocks. International stocks outperformed U.S. stocks in past decades, as well. Emerging-market equities have had higher average returns since the index started in 2001, but they also have been much more volatile than developed-market stocks. And emerging-market stocks rebounded from last year's bear market (when they were down more than 20%), we think they're still attractively valued and not yet reflecting policymakers' actions to boost growth.

Broadly Diversify Your Portfolio

Over time, a broadly diversified portfolio with many asset classes can provide better risk-adjusted performance and reduce swings in the value of your investments because each asset class plays a different role.

With U.S. stocks outperforming over the past several years, your portfolio may be out of balance. Your financial advisor can help you determine whether you should add international equities to return them to an appropriate weight in your portfolio based on your comfort with risk, time horizon and long -term goals. And the good news is that since many broad-based international equity investments include allocations to emerging markets, you may not need to add them separately.

Patrick went on to explain how to better manage your investments.



President Patrick then asked the group to stand, raise their glasses and join him in a toast to Rotary Around the World.
