Jeannine began by introducing Rotary Youth Exchange students, **Allison Izarnotegui** and **Dasha Benitez** and had them share some of their experiences from their year as RYE students.



Jeannine then shared how Covid-19 has affected the exchange and what their plans are for this year.

Why Virtual Exchanges? What is the Purpose?

To still provide a positive exchange experience.

To continue international relations.

To keep program momentum.

To encourage relationships for future inperson exchanges.

Engage Rotarians/Clubs not able to participate in the past and keep those that have participated engaged.

How does it work?

7-week program — students 15 - 17 yrs.

Starts with Orientation for students, host families, Counselors.

Students are paired with a student from another country.

Matched students will participate in weekly "Meet Ups" with each other.

Families of each student are the Host Family.

One-hour Group Zoom meetings - 3 times.

Attend a Rotary meeting in each country.

Types of Exchanges

Rotary Youth Exchange offers three types of exchange programs:

Long Term Exchange (LTE) These exchanges usually last one year, during which the student lives with more than one family in the host country and is required to attend school there. LTEs may be extended to include part or all of the holiday/vacation periods immediately before and after the academic year.

Short **Term Exchange Program (STEP)** These exchanges vary from several days to several weeks; they often take place when school is not in session and usually do not include an academic program. STEP is a family-to-family generally exchange, involving a homestay experience with a family in the host country, but they can also be organized as international youth camps or tours that bring together students from many countries.

New Generations Exchange These specialized short-term exchanges last three to six weeks and are open to young people ages 18-25. This program may include a element. D5180's vocational Committee is not participating in this program to date. Summer 2021 Virtual Youth Exchange Session

We are pleased to offer our second 8-week virtual youth exchange session (August-October 2021). This exchange pairs American high school students (15-17) with students of similar age from other countries. Exchange students help decide what topics they want to share about each other's country and culture during their weekly one-hour virtual Zoom 'MeetUps'. In addition, when possible, students will attend two Rotary Club meetings (one in each district).

During this 7-week program, students will alternate highlighting their home, city, country, and culture during weekly online meetings. This is not an educational exchange and more of a cultural learning exchange. Students will be allowed and encouraged to use translation programs and software if needed. Some language capabilities may be part of the student acceptance and matches. There will be a mandatory Zoom orientation for the student, parents, and club counselor one week before the start of the virtual exchange.
