Foundation have extended their partnership during the critical endgame phase of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative. Thanks to this partnership our contributions are matched two for one—\$25 becomes \$75.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

PE **Roland Wright** shared info and photos of his recent trip to Hawaii.

Hallsten Corporation has a contract to build a Handicapped Accessible Ramp System several stories high to board the USS Missouri in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. Roland Wright and his crew went to the site to field survey the pier deck and the ship deck to insure a proper fitment of these materials which will be fabricated in our Rotary Service Area in Highlands, CA. Hallsten North completely Engineer, Design and Fabricate these structures. They will be partially disassembled for packaging into containers and shipped by sea to Hawaii. The containers will be unloaded and the ramp fully erected at the site by Hallsten personnel in about four months. The USS Missouri a.k.a. 'Mighty Mo" is a United States Navy Iowa-class battleship. The *Missouri* was the last battleship commissioned by the United States and was best remembered as the site of the surrender of the Empire of Japan which ended World War II. This same ship was also fired upon Iraq in the Dessert Storm conflict.







USS Missouri in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii




USS Missouri boarding ramp


