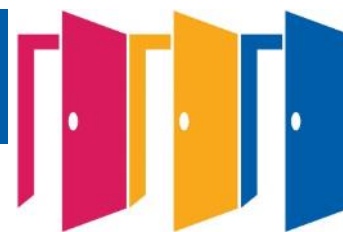

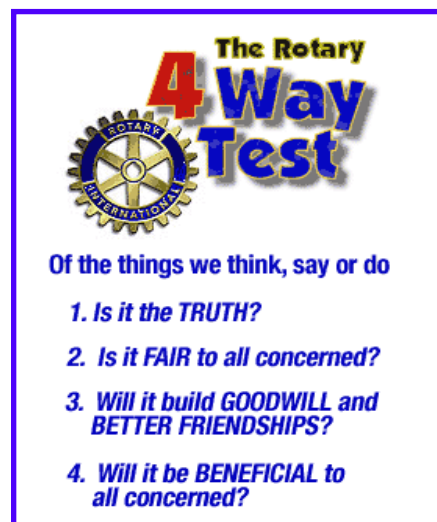
PE **Roland Wright** had a happy thought, he has been at the Hallsten Corporation for 39 years. He spun the wheel for \$10.

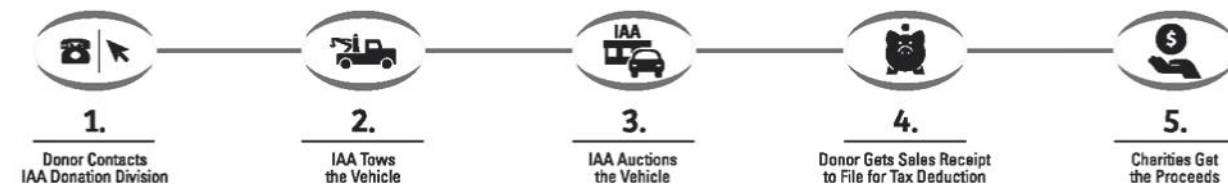
