

HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

PP David Stone introduced Greg Roeszler. coaching varsity football While at Sacramento's Encina High School, former NFL player Greg Roeszler, discovered a disturbing fact - one of his student athletes was sleeping in his car to avoid returning to a troubled home. Digging deeper with his team revealed the majority of his players faced daily struggles to survive and were surrounded by crime, gangs, violence, drugs and alcohol. Believing that coaches hold a key to building skills beyond the field, Roeszler founded Playmakers - a non-profit organization designed to build leadership and character through sports and academics. Founded in 2009, Playmakers began as a summer football camp integrating football skills and character lessons. Now in its eighth year, Playmakers provides after school and summer reading programs to at-risk youth and a Summer Football Academy for regional high schools. To date, Playmakers has touched the lives of more than 2,000 student athletes. THE **PLAYMAKER DIFFERENCE: The right** coach/teacher, the right equipment, the right incentives = better performance.

Greg was very proud to speak to a club who still does a pledge and prayer at its regular weekly meetings.

At a critical time in your life, did you have a person who helped you through it and made a significant difference. For **Greg Roeszler**, it was **Ernie Marston**, a former member of the Foothill-Highlands Rotary Club.

The gap between the low income and middle class students is vast.

Summer of 2015: Students in the Playmakers Summer Reading Program challenged themselves, and our mentors were by their side every step of the way.

Our dedicated staff of volunteers from the Sacramento State Student Athletes spent time working directly with the children for 50 days in June and July. With our reading program software tracking, we found that these students improved from 3/10 to a full academic year in their reading skills. All of these students were behind in grade-level reading, and face a variety of learning challenges. *We also found that girls comprised almost 50% of our program!*
