# HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S MEETING

PP **David Stone** introduced **Medo Eldin.** A natural-born entrepreneur with a passion for exploring opportunities at the intersection of digital media and business process optimization.

Medo's initial foray into the digital media space dates back to 1997 when, as a launched student at UCLA, he Cyberbruin.com, a portal site for the student body community. In what was a application of messaging pioneering technology at the time, the site featured native chat functionality designed to foster student-based collaboration discussion. While the concept was ahead of its time and ultimately short-lived, Medo remained fascinated by the limitless applications the Internet could facilitate. He would later go on to write his Masters' Thesis at Harvard on the transformational effect information technology was having on the U.S. residential real estate market.
