the **Lobby Bar** at **6:15 p.m.** and **Dinner** at **7:00 p.m.** The price per person will be \sim \$45 (same as last year.)


We will again have our traditional Gift Exchange with PEN **Patrick Magnani** assuming the role of Santa's Elf. The value of the gift should be ~\$20.




