HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

PE Marilee Monagan introduced Gregg Fishman. Gregg is a candidate for Sacramento County Supervisor, he has been a Sacramento area resident since 1979. He attended California State University, Sacramento and graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Journalism and minors in Communication Studies and Criminal Justice. In his career, he has been a reporter and anchor for KFBK and KGO Radio, a public information officer at SMUD and a communications coordinator for the California State Association of Counties.

Gregg was elected to the SMUD Board in 2014 and began serving in January, 2015. He served as Board President in 2018.

He is active in the community, having served on the Arden Park Recreation and Park District Board, and is a frequent volunteer with the Sacramento Tree Foundation. He is a 25-gallon blood donor and frequent volunteer master of ceremonies for Project Ride in Elk Grove.

Gregg and his wife, **Debra**, live in Arden Park and are the parents of two daughters.

Gregg began by talking about his experiences as a Group Study Exchange participant in Columbia in the 1990's and how much he enjoyed the opportunity

We are lucky to live and work in Sacramento—a community that is inclusive, provides opportunity, and has virtually unlimited potential for social and economic growth.

I'm running because I'm the right person at the right time to help unlock that potential, in

the same way I've helped unlock SMUD's potential to be one of the best, most cost-efficient utilities in the country.

Sacramento has a lot going for it, a lot of positive change, but there are nagging, growing problems that are weighing us down. We need bold, determined leadership to fix them.

Sacramento County must do better. On homelessness. On housing affordability. On getting the basics, like road repair, done quickly and correctly.


My values reflect our community and I'm the person in this race with the judgment, experience, and track record to bring the leadership we so desperately need to accomplish meaningful change.

Gregg then answered questions from the Rotarians. There were several questions about how SMUD has avoided the power outages that PGE costumers have had.

SMUD uses a fixed-wing airplane to patrol SMUD infrastructure in eastern and southeastern Sacramento County. SMUD is using a helicopter to patrol SMUD's transmission line corridors in Sacramento and El Dorado Counties.

In this aerial patrolling effort, SMUD is conducting remote sensing acquisition using lasers and high-resolution photography to identify encroachments and keep trees away from power lines and poles. By coupling what's called Light Detection and Ranging (LiDAR) technology with what's known as orthoimagery, SMUD identifies trees proven to be historically associated with causing power outages and strategically pinpoints trees using sophisticated data analysis.

This digital technology identifies vegetative growth and even dead and dying trees that pose a threat to public safety and power system reliability. The inspections are valuable not only from a preventive maintenance perspective, but also from the perspective of tree and brush management, ensuring vegetation isn't encroaching on SMUD's lines, which could cause electrical faults and outages.


