

Additional revenue continues to roll in from items listed for sale by Rotarians in our club on eBay and Craigslist; and of course, those many items sold in the bank lobby. Thank you to Mo, Sam, Jeff and **Dominic** for this extra oomph.

Total e-Waste recycling revenue YTD is \$319.47.

The evergreens fundraiser is moving along well and should prove to be another excellent contribution to the club's revenue bucket.

Raffle permit filed; taxes will be completed by 11/15 and all other filings with DOJ and State of CA are done. Club finances are in good shape.
