

# HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM


PP **Patrick Magnani** introduced **Sue Frost**, Sacramento County Supervisor, District 4.

**Sue** studied nursing and physical education at Pacific Union College in Napa and later specialized as an RN-California Certified Emergency Nurse. She has been a business owner for 34 years in the field of mortgage lending (retired 2014), consulting and real estate investments. She is a joint owner of Frost Enterprises Inc. FKA: I.F. Independent Financial Corporation, a full service mortgage bank that sold its operation and servicing in 1993 & 1995 to Centex Homes and Mellon Bank (respectively). Sue is a Real Estate Broker and a member of Sacramento Association of Realtors.

Sue has served on multiple boards, trade associations, and community groups; including serving as Vice President Birdcage Heights Neighborhood Association, Past President of the Citrus Heights Green Team, Vice President of Roseville Parkinson's Support Group, Vice Chair (Homelessness & Affordable Housing) of Tentmakers, and the Sacramento Association of Realtors where she served as the 2012 Education Committee Chair.

Sue was elected to the Citrus Heights City Council in 2012, and served as Vice-Mayor in 2014 and Mayor in 2015. On the council, Sue has championed fiscal discipline, encouraged economic growth & job creation, community involvement and public safety.

As Mayor, Sue not only led the city, but pioneered efforts to expand regional economic cooperation, support community non-profits and helped Veterans. District 4 is represented by **Sue Frost**, who was elected in November 2016. Supervisor **Frost's** district includes all or part of the communities of Citrus Heights, Folsom, Orangevale, Antelope, Rio Linda, Elverta, Gold River, Rancho Murieta, North Highlands, Carmichael, Foothill Farms and



Fair Oaks.

Sue then shared her thoughts on some of the problems facing the County, including County COVID-19 funding and how it is being used.

She continued talking about how defunding the police is NOT the answer. How will reducing the number of police officers make the community safer?

In 2018, police officers arrested 11,970 murderers, 495,900 violent criminals, and more than 1 million drunk drivers. In February of this year, a months-long investigation resulted in 518 arrests when police smashed a human trafficking ring and rescued hundreds of children who were being sold into prostitution.

Do activists think that councilors and community groups are going to detain violent gang members, break human trafficking rings or get drunk drivers off our roads?


Sue contended by answering questions from the Rotations and guests.
