

THE ROTARACT CLUB AT MERISTEM Club Liaison: Nick Broad



Meristem is a Fair Oaks school that prepares autistic young adults to enter the work force and live independently. Meristem has a Rotaract club sponsored by the Rotary Club of Fair Oaks. The Meristem Rotaract club helped us landscape the grounds at Center Point in 2019 by hauling and neatly spreading many, many cubic yards of wood-chip mulch on the front and north side areas. They also delivered food parcels for the Food Bank on Rotary Fridays during the summer of 2020.

This month, they are clearing a large patch of semi-public land that is used by neighborhood children to walk to Waldorf School, thereby avoiding hazardous traffic on Winding Way. Local residents have been maintaining the path to the Waldorf School for years and this year, Rotaract is helping.

Right - Two weeks ago, this area was covered in Scotch broom and brambles. Scotch broom is an invasive species that crowds out native plants and increases the risk of wildfires. Wild blackberries are also nonnative and invasive. Member Nick Broad surveys the completed work.


