

To date, we have collected \$303.07 toward our goal of \$1,000.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S MEETING

PP David Stone introduced **Tom Cicchini. Tom** has 25+ years experience as a financial advisor; the past 17 years with Raymond James Financial Services, Inc. **Tom** moved his office to Gold River, CA in the year 2000. In October 2013 he expanded, hiring several advisors and moved his office to Roseville, CA.

Tom's involvement with Rotary International goes back over 15 years and includes being Past President of the Rotary Club of North Sacramento, Past President of the Rotary Club of Natomas and Past President of the Rotary Club of Granite Bay.

Tom is currently Rotary District 5180 PolioPlus Chair and has served in that position since 2009. Last year Tom served as District 5180's Executive Secretary.

was also Rotary District 5180 Conference Chair, Trick or Treat at Squaw Creek, in 2010. **Tom** is a Bequest Society Member, Benefactor and Major Donor to the Rotary Foundation.

He has been the Polio Plus Chair for six years. His goal is to raise money differently than the normal route. Polio eradication is Rotary International's #1 priority and will continue to be for the next five years. All of your polio donations go towards your Paul Harris Fellow.

It is vital that Rotary eradicate polio. If we were to stop the process right now, it is predicted that the United States would see polio cases again within ten years. The last case of polio here was in 1979 in an Amish community. The only other disease that has been eradicated is small pox. Bill and Melinda Gates saw the need to eradicate polio and started a campaign. For every \$1 a Rotarian raises for polio, the Gates will donate \$2. It is estimated that it will take \$5 billion to eradicate polio due to births, new tribes, religion and lack of trust in Western Civilization.

Here are some ways, we can contribute in raising funds for polio.

Partnering up with a local restaurant, yogurt shop, or coffee shop and ask that on a certain day a percentage of their sales go to our polio campaign.



Rotary River Cats Day is coming up on Sunday, June 5th. Tickets are \$22. Eight dollars of that \$22 goes to polio and is recorded in your name toward your Paul Harris. If you can't make it that day, you can still purchase tickets and use them on a different day. We can also donate tickets to a 501 c-3 non-profit. These tickets are \$10. And for every ticket you purchase, the River Cats matches that ticket. So two people can go to the game. You can sell tickets to friends - the tickets are \$22 whether you buy them or they buy them. So why not get the \$8 credit toward your Paul Harris? And the best part - Bill Gates matches that amount!
