

# HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM

**IPP Patrick** introduced Magnani County Supervisor Sacramento Susan **Peters. Susan** is serving her fourth term on the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors representing the Third District after having been first elected in 2004 and re-elected in 2008, 2012, and 2016. The Third District includes the unincorporated communities of Arden Arcade, Carmichael, Fair Oaks, Foothill Farms and North Highlands as well as the neighborhoods of Campus Commons, College Greens, and Glenbrook in the City of Sacramento.

In addition to the Board of Supervisors, she serves on a number of boards including the Sacramento Area Council of Governments where she served as chair during 2011, the Sacramento Area Flood Control Agency which she chaired in 2009 and the Sacramento Transportation Authority where she served as chair in 2006 and 2014.

On the Board of Supervisors, she has worked to insure that local government is focused on the right priorities, taxpayer monies are accountable and managed well, and decisions are based upon sound information and research to enable Sacramento County to attract new businesses. revitalize area business districts and maintain our neighborhoods. Accomplishments to date include the revitalization of the two major commercial corridors (Fulton Avenue and Auburn Boulevard), the opening of three neighborhood parks by the Carmichael Recreation and Park District (Patriots, O'Donnell Heritage, and Jan Parks), the expansion of Eastern Oak Community Park in Arden Arcade by the Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District, the successful completion of Phases 1 and 2 of the Hazel Avenue Improvement Project in Fair Oaks as well as the Phases 1 and 2 of Carmichael's Fair Oaks Boulevard Improvement Project. She also was instrumental with the creation of the North Watt Avenue Partnership and the Carmichael Improvement District.

Recognizing the need to maintain the quality of residential life in the unincorporated suburban area, Susan approved the creation on-going implementation and of Department of Transportation's Neighborhood Traffic Management Program that allows residents to develop plans for their neighborhoods to combat speeding and cut-through traffic. She also was successful in forging a partnership with the California Highway Patrol in creating a maximum enforcement program targeting speeders on major roadways in the unincorporated area. Another significant initiative she promotes is "Pothole annual **Sweeps** conducted in the fall by the Department of Transportation as part of a concentrated effort to identify and fill potholes in order to protect and preserve the transportation infrastructure in preparation for inclement winter weather.

**Susan** is a former Board Chair of the Sacramento Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce where she spearheaded efforts to locate Raley Field in West Sacramento. She also was a founding member of the Northern California World Trade Center, and a past president of the Sacramento Theater Company.

In addition to her elected duties, she serves as Board Chair of the Leland Stanford Mansion Foundation which restored the historic home of California's eighth governor.


**Susan's** connection to the Third District dates back when she grew up in the Old Foothill Farms area. She currently resides in Arden Arcade and formerly lived in Carmichael and Fair Oaks.

**Susan** gave us an update on SP1 the gas tax, she reviewed how the county's portion is being used and the projects in her district. There is a section on the County web site that lists all of the SP1 projects.

She next talked about the realignment of the jail system and how it is affecting the Sacramento county jail system and the amount of money the county will need to spend on new jails and deputy sheriff's.

She reviewed the plans for the Airport and how it has grown and plans for the future and how the Amazon fulfilment center is impacting the area.

This will be **Susan's** last term on the Board.
