Patrick gave a 10min presentation with his wife **Jennifer** today complete with a slideshow for their time in France.







New guest shared by PP Joe Kaiser

We welcome our most recent guest to Rotary House: Lyndsey Asbury, the mother of a five month old baby girl, Shakti Rose. Shakti is immediately suffering from a brain tumor and she has been diagnosed with Li-Fraumeni syndrome (LFS), is a rare syndrome in which patients are predisposed to cancer. It is characterized by the wide variety of cancer types seen in affected patients, a young age at onset of malignancies, and the potential for multiple primary sites of cancer during the patient's lifetime.

Lyndsey is a single mother and lives in Grass Valley with Shakti. Still traumatized by the emergency that brought Shakti to the hospital a few days ago, Lyndsey is overwhelmed with the generosity of Rotarians and she can't believe she has been chosen to stay at Rotary House. She said the house is beautiful and she can just feel the love throughout. Courtney Corbitt, the UC Davis Children's Hospital social worker and Rotary House liaison, commented that she has always felt the very positive energy in Rotary House. Several times during our initial interview, Lyndsey struggled to hold back tears.

This latest medical emergency is not Shakti's first. When she was just a month old, she was diagnosed with cancer in her abdomen. With this latest diagnosis, Shakti has a long, tough battle ahead. We keep both Shakti and her mother in our thoughts.

September 24, 2016 - Building Your Public Image Team


December 3, 2016 - Using Facebook and Social Media

Eric has trained people from over 500 different companies including:


