Vocational Service calls on every Rotarian to work with integrity and contribute their expertise to the problems and needs of society. Rob Auernig is the chairperson and he will be looking for people in the community that the club can recognize with Vocational Vocational Awards, also known as the "People of the Year" awards. The vocations that have been recognized in the past have been school teacher, peace officer and business person of the year. Rob will plan vocational visits. In past years we have visited the Blood Source, the Harris Center and the new Sacramento Airport terminal. Rob will make sure that a Vocational speaker (member of the club) is ready to give a five minute talk at every meeting.

International Service exemplifies our global reach in promoting peace and understanding. We support this service avenue by sponsoring or volunteering on international projects, seeking partners abroad, and more. Bryan Daniel is once again the chair person for this import avenue. Past projects that the club has contributed to have been funding the building of desks and chairs for schools in Honduras, microcredit loans for women starting small businesses in Africa, building water wells in Tanzania, and supporting the Shelter Box program.

Youth Service recognizes the importance of empowering youth and young professional through leadership development programs such as Interact, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA), and Rotary Youth Exchange (RYE). Headed up by Jeff Valtman, the distribution of dictionaries will benefit the children of Orangevale. Other activities that falls under this avenue is participating in the district speech contest, awarding classroom grants, and selecting two students to attend RYLA camp.
