Dean Hendricks was introduces as our District Youth Protection Officer for our Youth Protection training

District 5180 has a district policy on yourth protection:

- 1. We have 0 tolerance for harassment or abuse.
- 2. We must safeguard children from physical, sexual or psychological abuse.

Rotaty Youth Exchange has its own auditing, but each club must make sure its President, youth protection officer and anyone working with youth one-on-one be fully vetted, incluing a

background check every 3 years for general members working with youth and every year for Youth Protection Officers. Any inappropriate behavior should be reported to the Youth Protection Officer. Remember "It doesn't matter what your intentions are, it matters how it's received."

Fewer than 4% of reports prove to be false, so it is important to take them seriously.

If you observe inappropriate behaviors, comment to the adult directly or report to your Youth Protection Officer.

To help prevent abuse, try to reduce isolation and provide opportunities to develop proper relationships. Be aware of problems.
