
Therefore, President Don said there wasn't much to do and he ended the meeting without a club assembly. It was like being released early to go out and play!

Audrey Smith-Weiberg has Rotarians lined up to help her at the Special Olympics Annual Prom to provide appetizers and drinks. Volunteers will prepare and serve the appetizers, dessert and drinks as well as set up and clean up. The prom will be held at the La Sierra Community Center in Carmichael on Friday evening.

Dennis Sarkisian, Community service. Twelve Rotarians volunteered to help at the Food Bank last Friday. Ninety-six families (295 people) arrived to receive food. There were ten new applicants.

Dennis said to that the next American River Clean Up will be on Saturday, June 1.

Dennis said that the applications for the **Laird Smith scholarship** and the **Rotary club scholarships** have arrived from Casa Roble and Bella Vista High School. Bill Wagner added that the **Knights of Columbus** will be making breakfast burritos at the Big Day kick off at Casa Roble High School. Breakfast will start at 7:30am.

Bill said that he was interviewed on Orangevale Live about the Knights of Columbus's wine tasting event on April 16 at the Newman Center at CSUS. Tickets cost \$50 and the proceeds benefit the Bishop Gallegos Maternity Home for unwed mothers.

Vocational Talk

Lorie Rheams was supposed to give her vocational talk but she and Russ are on travel. **Bill Wagner** offered to give his vocational talk about Long Term Care Insurance.

Bill has worked for 25 years in the Long Term Health Care market. Most of the products he sold were pay-as-you-go.

Now Bill prefers Asset Based Long Term Care for his clients and he is helping some of his clients convert from the pay-as-you-go to asset-based. For example, he can use money that will never be spent (such as money in an IRA or 401K). The money goes into a fixed based



product like an annuity from State Life of America. Then the money goes into a tax qualified long term care life insurance which can cover a husband and a wife.

You can cancel the plan at anytime and you get 100% of your money back. There is no large surrender penalty. Bill suggests you talk to your financial planner for more information.
