Derek Clark was introduced as the owner of Palm Tree Brewing and The Boardwalk. Prior to 2010 he was a Real Estate and Mortgage broker, until in July of 2010 his whole perspecive changed after he was hit by a truck. He spet 2 years recovering and relearning how to do things, and eventually building a brewing system that he could use with his physical limitations.

He started a small brewery near Adelbertos and grew into his current location at Palmtree Brewing. He's currently working on a larger building at Pershing and Main.

He bought the Boardwalk after the prior owners closed it down, and he now claims to be "herding cats" as he keeps it open as a restaraunt, pub and entertainment

venue. He has 300-340 seats for the public, and uses a tourbus as the greenroom for the band. 100% collected at the door goes to charity, as he says food and drink covers operations, and he wants to give back. The charities he supports help families, veterans and pets at risk.

"What we do at the bar and kitchen takes care of the employees, what we do at the door takes care of the community."
