ur guest speaker was Jennifer Robinson from the firm Market Force. Her presentation was incredibly interesting! Did you know that the human brain is always in survival mode? Apparently, we're very good at registering potential threats, and this can interfere with success. But if we can understand that the people we interact with are always in "survival mode", we can help reduce stress and improve our relationships with others. For instance, Ms. Robinson explained that when we meet someone, it only takes about 15 seconds for our brain to draw conclusions about that person's trustworthiness. Our impression of their

trustworthiness is going to be different depending on whether we are motivated by "sincerity" or "competency". We should try to "treat others as they want to be treated". One thing to avoid: asking "Why" questions. These types of questions trigger defensive mechanisms in our brains, making us think we're being judged and found wanting. One hint: if you're dealing with someone who is upset and you want them to tell you what is bothering them, don't look them in the eye – they'll be more likely to be expansive if you're not staring at them. One suggestion – go for a walk with them. People speak more easily to each other when they're walking next to each other.

Another point Ms. Robinson made is that people have a tendency to play either "offense" or

"defense". Offense driven people are inclined to want to go go go! They are "creational" -- always looking for new ways to do things. "Defense" driven people are "preservational" and tend to be more inclined to favor the status quo. Organizations thrive with both types of people, but they can drive each other nuts!

I think I can safely say that the whole mongoose colony at the meeting was fascinated by Ms. Robinson, and left the meeting with a lot of new insights into how we interact with others.
