End Polio NOW!! Let's Finish the Job!!

Over 35 years ago, Rotary made a commitment to immunize the world's children against polio.

Thanks to Rotary, the number of polio cases was more than 350,000 annually. Since 1985, that has been slashed by more than 99.9 percent, preventing five million instances of childhood paralysis and 250,000 deaths.

In 2020, there were 140 new cases reported worldwide. In 2021, the total number of new cases of the wild poliovirus that have occurred worldwide were 5...four in Afghanistan and one in Pakistan. Pakistan has now been almost a full year without a new case being reported. This is amazing progress as we have never before seen so few new cases in one year!

The final 0.01 percent of cases will be the most difficult and expensive to prevent for a variety of reasons, including geographical isolation, worker fatigue, armed conflict, COVID-19 and cultural barriers.

For these reasons, it is so important to continue to generate the funds needed to finish the job. To ease up now would be to invite a polio resurgence that would condemn millions of children to lifelong paralysis in the years ahead.

The stakes are high. As long as polio threatens even one child anywhere in the world, all children – wherever they live – remain at risk.

How can you help? If you haven't done so, please join this fight by signing up for the Polio Plus Society (PPS). Give at least \$100 to 'End Polio' this year and pledging, by signing the PPS form, that you will donate \$100 per year until our world has been declared Polio-Free. You will receive Paul Harris Fellow credit as well. And, if you have already given \$100, that counts too! You just need to sign the PPS form to receive your End Polio Now wristband and Polio Plus Society pin. For a PPS form, go to www.rotary5180.org.
