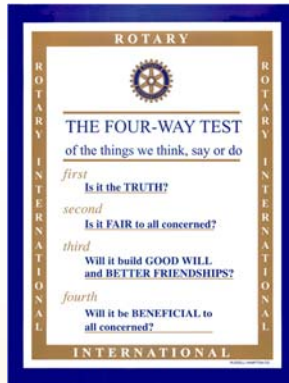
At the conclusion of your chat, an invitation is extended to be a member of RCWG, District 5180. With your acceptance, we welcome you to RCWG!
