President Barbara opened the meeting by –

- Announcing that this month is -

“Rotary Water & Sanitation Month”.

Worldwide, more than 748 million people live without access to clean water and at least 3,000 children die each day from diarrheal diseases caused by unsafe water. Rotary is working to change that. For example, members have used a Rotary grant to drill more than 20 clean-water wells and to repair another 30 in villages across Ghana. The project also included education about and treatment of Buruli ulcer, a debilitating infection that if left untreated can lead to disability and death. Nearly 70,000 people will benefit from this initiative.

She then played the Rotary International (Utube) video called

“See how grants from Rotary have helped bring clean water to rural Africa.”

Some of the work has already started, as Rtns. Yuki and Tineke had had a meeting with him in his house recently and next week he and Rtn. Tineke will go to Flores to see the start of the project. Also on 20th April 2016, the person in charge of the GG in Flores, Gilles Raymond, will come to our club to give a talk about the project.

- Asked SaA Leith to introduce Visiting Rotarians and Guests.
- Gave Apologies for IPP. Doris and Rtns. Manfred, Sally, Pamela, Janelle, Christian and Florian.
- Thanked Rtn. Detlev for opening a ‘What’s App’ Sunday Brunch dialogue – it was fun to share his Easter Pictures. Next Sunday’s Brunch will have a famous German magician.
- Introduced John Germ, next Rotary Year’s President of Rotary International.

When John Germ takes office as Rotary International's President in July 2016, it will mark his 40th year in Rotary. In that time, he's likely best-known for leading Rotary's \$200 Million Challenge, a fundraising effort sparked by a challenge grant from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. Rotarians surpassed that goal in 2011, raising \$228.7 million towards polio immunization activities. **"I never questioned that we would raise the funds,"** he said. **"Rotarians have been so generous."**

In fact, raising money for polio was one of John Germ's first leadership roles. He became a member of the Rotary Club of Chattanooga, Tennessee, USA, in 1976. **"I wasn't involved, other than going to meetings, until 1983 when I was asked to be club secretary,"** he said. **"Then I was asked to participate as district co-chair for the polio fundraising campaign."** After that, he was hooked. **"The more active I became, and the more good that I saw being done, the more I wanted to do,"** he said.

John Germ went on to serve Rotary as vice president, director, Foundation trustee and vice chair, and RI president's aide. He and his wife, Judy, are also members of the Arch Klumph Society.

"When asked: If you could have a personal conversation with every Rotarian, what would you say to each of them?

John Germ replied: **"I would say thank you for what you have done; thank you for what you are doing; and thank you for what you are going to do to improve your community and change lives. I would also ask them to repay the opportunity someone gave them by asking each member to invite another person to become a Rotarian."**

- Asked Rtn. Yuki to read the '4-Way Test.

 - **Global Grant 1410647 Water and Sanitation** (to observe the RCBS Global Grant activities in action in cooperation with the John Fawcett Foundation). Rtn. Erika said that she would be attending the 3-day project in Pupu Village, which has the full support of the local Gianyar government, to observe -
 - Wednesday, 6th April 2016 (8am) - Eye screening for 5 children's schools - approx. 500 children.
 - Thursday, 7th April 2016 (8am) - Eye screening, free reading glasses distribution and cataract surgery for Adults – targeting 500 adults.
 - Friday, 8th Apr 2016 (8am)- Post surgery check-ups.
 Any member who is interested in attending is most welcome.
 - **Akasa Learning Centre** - Friday, 8th April, 2016 from 2:00pm to 3:30 pm (introduced by Rtn. Detlev). We will see the property, the classrooms in the Community & Learning Centre and finally - the kids, who always stand in first line and in central position. This organization has presented the Board with a Power Point proposal, but we first need to visit the Centre and present our findings to the RCBS Board before a decision can be made to donate to them.
 - **16th Annual Rotary Club Bali Nusa Dua Charity Golf Tournament.** Saturday, 9th April 2016 - RCBS members and friend are all welcome to participate. (Cost IDR 1.5million per person. See details below).



- **A Cocoa and Lontar Sugar Farm VOCATIONAL TOUR on Friday, 15th April 2016 .** -The trip takes about two hours from Seminyak and visitors will be able to see the pod farm and the production plant. They will also see how the farm actually grows the cocoa pods on trees, how it picks them and crushes them and then smooths them out. The farm also has a chocolate outlet, elephants and mountain bike rides and a restaurant. It is a unique spot. (Rtn. Alex had taken a group tour there last week and he was very impressed). PN. Mission



Kupu-Kupu Foundation works to improve the lives of physically and mentally disabled children, adolescents and adults in the Districts of Bangli and Gianyar in Bali.



History



- Registered in February 2000 in Spain & October 2000 in Bali
- Work in Bangli and Gianyar Districts
- Most of the funding has come from Spain so far
- Opened office and school in 2002 in Ubud and in 2009 in Bangli.
- Opened a shop in 2004 in Ubud

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Main problems of people with disabilities

- Isolation, they don't go out or have never been out
- Lack of self-esteem, they feel embarrassed or ashamed
- Lack of integration
- They have never seen another person with disabilities
- Lack of stimulation
- Many of them cannot read or write

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Objectives

- Assist with medical care - medicines, physiotherapy and surgical operations
- Provide wheelchairs and other physical aids
- Adapt facilities to make them more handicapped friendly
- Increase the awareness of the local community about the problems of the handicapped
- Get handicapped children into school
- Help them become more independent through selling their handicrafts in our shop in Ubud

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Facilities - School



- We have two schools; one in Bangli and one in Ubud.
- The students come once a week.
- We pick up students at 9 am and drop them back home at 5 pm
- It is non formal teaching
- The maximum group of students is around 7 or 8 per day.
- Open to any kind of disability
- Any age - from 5 years old to 40 years old.

- Going into the community

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Supplies and Equipment



- Many disabled people have never been out of their house.
- Supplied more than 200 wheelchairs.
- For many, it is the first time they have seen a wheelchair.
- We train people to use wheelchairs (clients and family).
- Wheelchairs give mobility and open the door for socialization.
- Their whole life changes.
- Also provide crutches, tools, etc.

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Education



- Many have never been to school.
- We try to get them into regular school if possible.
- Many do not even know how to read or write.
- Cover a wide range of educational needs.

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Socialization



- Getting people out of the house into the community.
- Seeing other disabled people and realising that they are not alone.
- Making friends.
- Learning how to interact.
- Experiencing Bali and learning about where they live.
- Not being embarrassed anymore.
- Building confidence.
- Increasing community awareness and sensitivity.

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Kupu Kupu Gallery



- We have a shop in Ubud selling handicraft made by people with disabilities.
- The shop was opened in May 2004.
- We have employed 5 people with disabilities in the shop.
- We sell handicraft from more than 25 suppliers with disabilities.
- Empowering them to maintain a regular income from their creations, as well as raising vital funds for the Kupu Kupu Foundation.
