Rtn. Oliver spoke about the importance of TRF for its service with projects in the 6 areas of focus: **1. Promoting Peace 2. Providing Clean Water 3. Saving Mothers and Children 4. Supporting Education 5. Growing Local Economies 6. Fighting Disease**

Our 35,000 clubs carry out sustainable service projects that support these 6 causes. TRF can save a life and eradicate Polio with every \$1 committed to this cause Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation commits \$2.

Every 3 years, 50% of our club contributions are given back to the club for use with projects, Global Grants, District Grants, etc. It is encouraged that members donate \$100 to TRF, but any amount is acceptable.

Annual General Meeting (AGM), Nov. 14th- Nominations for new RCBS Board Members for 2019-20

Erika announced that the Annual General Meeting will be held next week, **Nov. 14**. **PP Anita and PP Marie Françoise** will be the election committee for the nomination ballots to be offered to members to nominate a candidate for the positions of President-Elect (2020-21), VP1, VP2, Secretary and Treasurer. Members are asked

to contact the committee with nominations of members for positions with the permission of the nominee. Ballots were sent to all members with the criteria for the positions for nomination.

D3420 Rotary Disaster Relief (RDR)- Palu-Donggala / Lombok



P. Erika gave a rundown of the progress of the **Rotary Disaster Relief (RDR)** for D3420 for Palu and Donggala areas in Sulawesi hit by the tragic earthquake and tsunami, chaired by RC Makassar, Pres. Malik Faisal. Now that the distribution of survival kits has been completed (1,000 kits dispersed), the focus is now the mobile clinic, trauma healing and Rotary wooden houses (USD 415) per unit. RDR for Lombok from their devastating earthquake, chaired by RC Lombok, Pres. Ace Robin. The contribution from the District has been **Rp.**

67,232,560. There have been a total of 672 shelter boxes, mattresses (120 sets), blankets (300 sets), big tents, clothing and 212 Rotary wooden houses. Presently facing rainy season the 50 more units of wooden houses are ready to be built in North Lombok. Great job D 3240 ! Guest Speaker: Ivanda Amor Ganelson: Bumida-Bumiputera Insurance

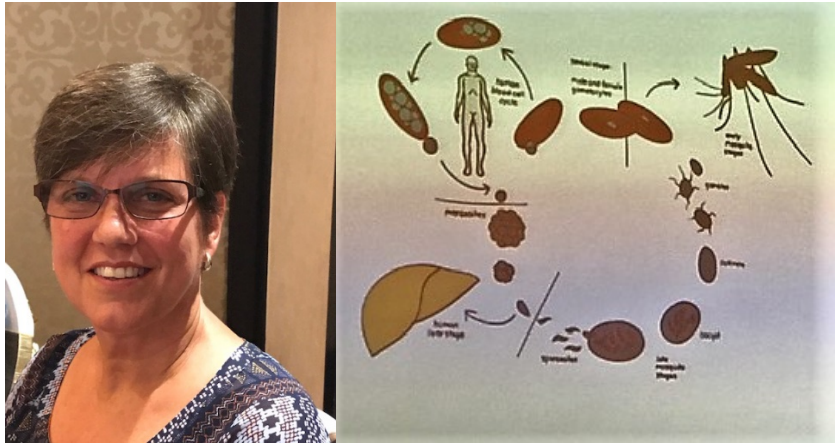
“Self Accident Insurance”



Guest Speaker, **Ivanda Ganelson** from Bumiputera Insurance profiled the company for personal, company, accident, insurance and claim procedure. Bumida was established in 1987 and covers property, liability, motor vehicle, personal accident, etc. insurance. The Risk Based Capital (RBC) in 2017 was 230%. Accident means, “an unfortunate incident that happens unexpectedly and unintentionally,, typically resulting in damage or injury. The premium cost per year is RP. 1,000,000. Guest Speaker: Cory Verge: “Malaria Eradication in Indonesia”



Cory Verge does Partner Development with CORE Solutions Indonesia, founded by Jackie Kennedy in 2014 and based in the USA. The program presented to the club was “Health Access Sumbawa” (HAS) for remote communities. The original mission was to control malaria in 3 hamlets, which is now successful after 3 years with treated mosquito nets, a diagnostic laboratory and two health workers. The service of HAS has made a difference to 1,000 remote village residents in a community of 4,000 people without running water, toilets, malnutrition, and minimal health care. While presently working on an infrastructure for the village needs, HAS plans to expand its service area once a new road is built to include 6,000 more people while also continuing to monitor malaria. HAS recognizes the use of recycled plastic bottles to be implemented as water tanks, field enclosures and “bottle bricks” with adobe and cement mortar for building structures. HAS intends to stay deeply involved with these communities for the long term and with the assistance from donations from concerned humanitarians.
