



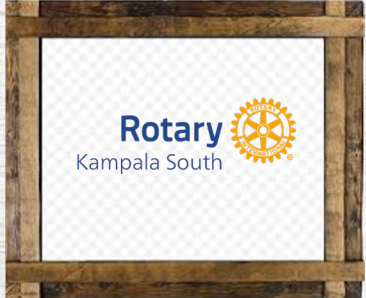

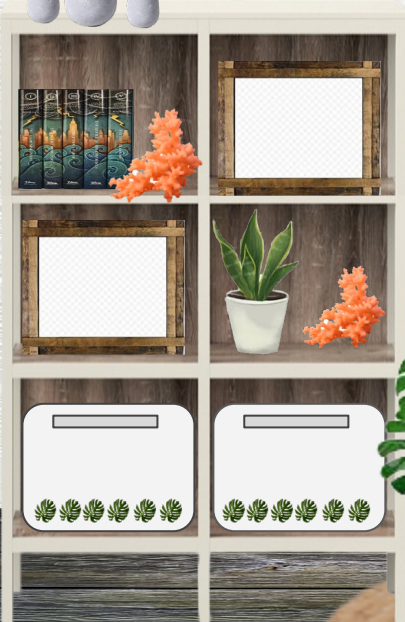

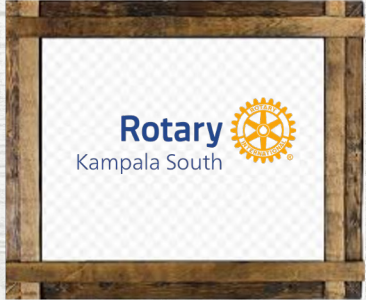

What are RCCs?





A Rotary Community Corps (RCC) is a team of non-Rotarian men and women who are committed to their community's long-term economic development and self-sufficiency.

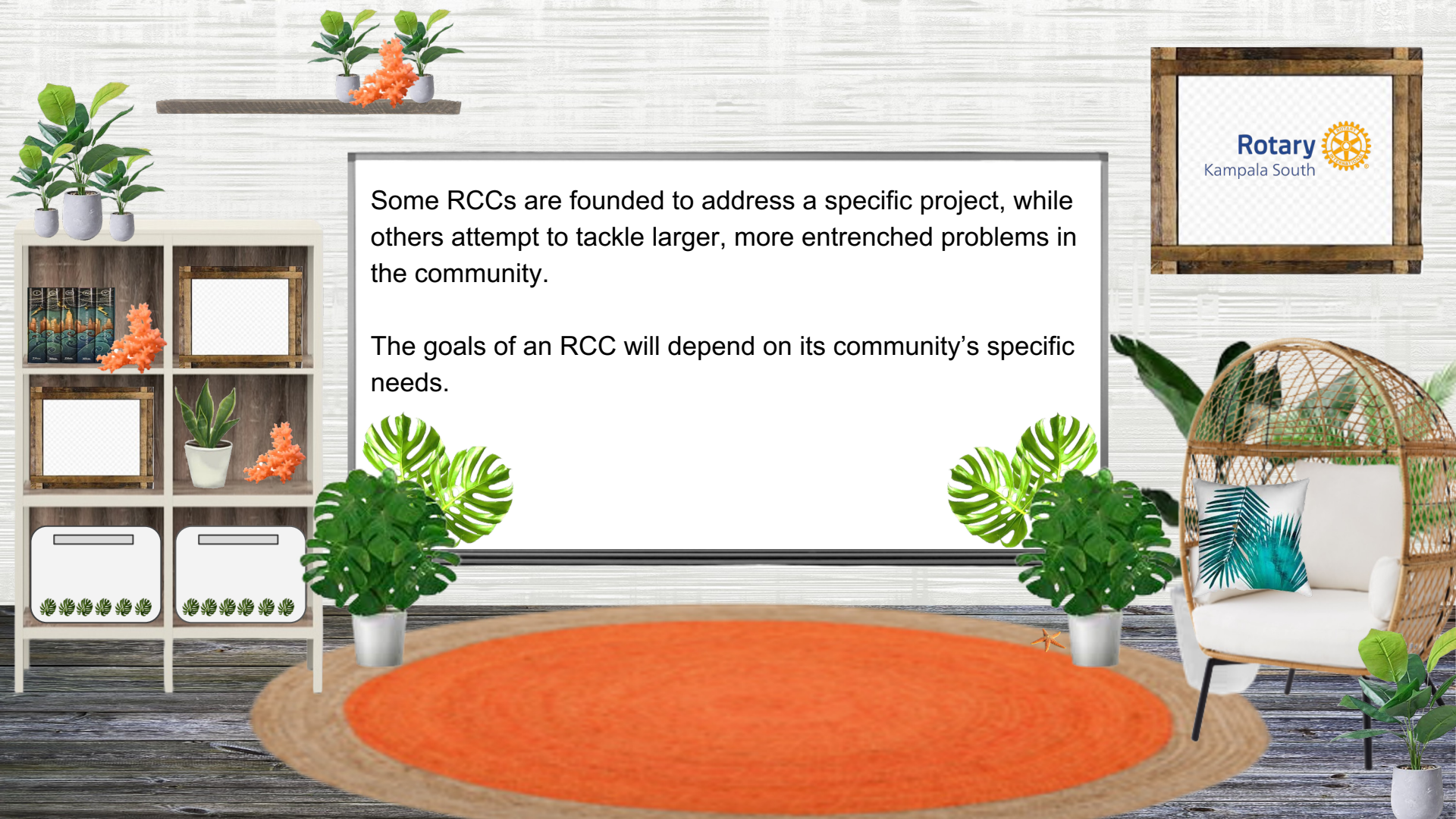




An RCC is sponsored by a Rotary club, the Rotary club acts as its partner in service for community development projects.

As representatives of the community being served, RCC members bring enthusiasm, creativity, and sustainability to the projects they design and implement.





Some RCCs are founded to address a specific project, while others attempt to tackle larger, more entrenched problems in the community.

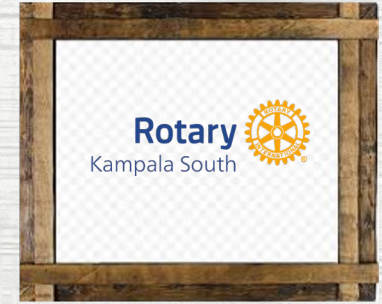
The goals of an RCC will depend on its community's specific needs.





Joining an RCC does expand opportunities for members to collaborate with Rotarians and develop leadership skills that will allow them to better participate in their community in an active and meaningful way.

The partnership between an RCC and its sponsoring Rotary club is mutually beneficial, as it enhances Rotary's image and impact in the community.



GOALS OF RCCs

1. Encourage individuals to take responsibility for the improvement of their community.
2. Recognize the dignity and value of all useful occupations.





GOALS OF RCCs cont'd

3. Mobilize self-help activities and collective work to improve quality of life.
4. Encourage the development of human potential to its fullest, within the context of the local culture and community.

Basic Guidelines of RCCs

1. Membership is open to non-Rotarian men and women who reside, are employed, or study near the RCC community. 10 members are required to start.
2. RCCs should meet at least once per month.

Basic Guidelines of RCCs cont'd

3. RCCs are encouraged to undertake two major projects annually.
4. Any membership dues should be nominal
