





- ☐ The Boy Child Uplifting Program BCUP is one of the core pillars of the 2023-24 Rotary District 9213 agenda, focusing on uplifting the boy child. The girl-child had been the centre of focus for more than 25 years after centuries of injustice and discrimination at the hands of male hegemony and patriarchy that characterize our society.
- ☐ This effort has increasingly left the boy child in an environment that has eroded confidence and general holistic human value systems and supportive structures.
- \square As such, the Rotary Club of Kampala South opted to take a values-driven mentorship approach in the implementation of this area of focus.



- The chair presented the overview and background of the BCUP program whose main goal is to empower and support the boy child and particularly for this session, the objective was to mentor the boys through sharing learning experiences and imparting Value based skills.



BCUP District Grand Fundraiser – Ist DEC 2023

The RCKS on Ist Dec 2023 participated in the BCUP Program Grand Fundraiser that featured a number of Ugandan musicians and Rotary Clubs.

RC Kla South bought a table and also was part of the Organizing Committee

BCUP – MoTiV & RCKS Partnership

- On 16th October 2023, the Rotary Club of Kampala South signed an MOU with MoTiV to mobilize young individuals with a focus on boys and young men to acquire skills in different sectors using the Youth Entrepreneurship Trainers (YETs)
- On 28th December 2023, MoTiV and RCKS jointly conducted with a Community Needs Assessment and engaged 37 youth including boys as well as visited 4 villages in Mukki
- MoTiV conducted Soap Making training on 5th February 2024 targeting 31 young people; 18 of whom were boys. This has enhanced skills and will bring them income



BCUP Launch & Fundraiser – 28TH AUG 23

- On 28th August 2023 we successfully held the BCUP RCKS Launch and Fundraiser event with the aim of supporting the Mukki RCC Dance Troupe comprised of over 35 young people including 16 boys/men.
- □ UGX 3 million was raised and these funds were used to purchase costumes and pay for trainers for the Mukki Dance Troupe as well as facilitate an Exposure Visit and Mentorship session for the boys in Kampala
- □ As a result; the Mukki Dance
 Troupe has been invited to perform at
 3 events and so far earned income
 of UGX 4,200,000



Project Background

- The Rotary Club of Kampala South in partnership with Rotary International partners is implementing a 2-year Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) global grant project in Kyaka 2 Refugee settlement in Kyegegwa district during the Rotary years 2023/24 & 24/25.
- Kyaka 2 is a government refugee settlement operated by UNHCR and houses over 125,000 refugees mainly from DRC.
- Following a comprehensive needs assessment by Rotary Club of Kampala South in consultation with Office of the Prime Minister, UNHCR and Kyegegwa District, this project was designed with the overall goal of reduction of vulnerability of refugees and host community to public health risks in the Kyaka 2 settlement through enhancing water, sanitation facilities.



Project Objectives

The Project primary targets to achieve the following;

- Improvement & upgrade 4 rain water harvesting systems in Mukondo Health Centre, Itabaninga Primary school, Byabakora Primary school and Bujubuli health Centre. The system will serve 3,984 female and 4,016 males in the target area.
- Construction of 100m³ steel tank, pump fittings, chain link for Buliti water supply targeting to supply over 10,000 individuals
- Construction of mobile water quality laboratory at Sweswe, installation of testing equipment to serve an estimated 30,000 individuals
- Extension of electricity to Bujubuli water system plant

Implementation Status



• On October 20th 2023, the Rotary Club of Kampala South together with Rotary/Rotaract club of Kabarole and their cooperating partner AQUA methods Uganda launched the two year WASH project and Polio awareness at Itambabinga Health Outpost (one of the beneficiary site) in Kyaka II refugee settlement, Kyegegwa District and this activity was joined by kyaka II Water and Sanitation Hygiene partners; United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR), Nsamizi, OXFAM, Office of the Prime Minister (OPM), Kyegegwa Local Government, Kyegewa sub-county, the refugee leadership structure and the local communities.

Implementation Status

The launched project is worth USD.100,000 and is to benefit the communities of more than 52650 population from 6 zones of Sweswe, (Bwiriza, Bukere), Itambabinga, Byabakora and Bujubuli (Buliti) zones. The 2year project main key activities that were launched include; Improvement and upgrade of existing 04 rain water harvesting systems Health Centre and 3 schools), Construction of a 100m³ concrete tank at Sweswe water plant, Construction of mobile Water quality laboratory at Sweswe water plant and Extension of Electricity to Bujubuli Water system plant
