MUNA is a Rotary District project designed to create an awareness of the role of the United Nations in mediating international issues. Teams of three students from years 11 or 12 select a country; research its history, politics, economics, peoples, international alignment and policies in current world affairs. Having chosen a country they then debate selected resolutions from each country's point of view in a mock United Nations Assembly.

MUNA occurs in March each year, and two students are then sponsored to attend the national MUNA titles in Canberra in August.

Quintrex (boat builders) Vocation Tour

The Quintrex factory is located on a 10 acre site at the Gold Coast's

Marine Precinct and is a rare opportunity to view the complete manufacturing process including the process of plasma cutting; pressing and welding of marine grade aluminium, custom designed paint booths and the complete fitout of the boat.

They currently produce more than 300 boat models ranging in size from 2–7 metres, produces up to 50 boats a day and over 12, 000 boats annually.


