

#### President's Report

Thursday October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2017 our meeting took place at the Southport Golf Club. Dinner was sliced roast beef and gravy, broccoli, roasted potatoes, carrots and warm bread rolls.

Our guest speakers that week was Professor Richard John who currently leads two community engagement initiatives at Griffith University: the Griffith Science Education Alliance (a collaboration between Griffith University, the Qld Department of Education and Training, the Gold Coast City Council and the Science Teachers Association of Queensland) and Science on the GO!

These programs provide local schools and the broader community with access to engaging science experiences and in-depth, ongoing, innovative approaches to science education. In the last six years in excess of 150 000 students, teachers and members of the public have been engaged.

Richard has published 60 papers in international peer-reviewed journals, is the author of an undergraduate chemistry textbook. He has taught undergraduate chemistry for over 20 years and held

teaching and research positions at the University of Oxford and the University of Wollongong prior to his arrival to Griffith University. Richard's latest learning books for young students, see plots below


Rotary partners with Habitat for Humanity

# Barry Rassin selected to be 2018-19 Rotary president

Barry Rassin, of the Rotary Club of East Nassau, New Providence, Bahamas, is the selection of the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International for 2018-19. He will be declared the president-elect on 1 September if no challenging candidates have been suggested.

As president, Rassin aims to strengthen our public image and our use of digital tools to maximize Rotary's reach.

"Those who know what good Rotary clubs do will want to be a part of it, and we must find new models for membership that allow all interested in our mission to participate," he says.

"With Rotary more in the public eye, we will attract more individuals who want to be part of and support a membership organization that accomplishes so much good around the world."

Rassin earned an MBA in health and hospital administration from the University of Florida and is the first fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives in the Bahamas. He recently retired after 37 years as president of Doctors Hospital Health System, where he continues to serve as an adviser. He is a lifetime member of the American


Hospital Association and has served on several boards, including the Quality Council of the Bahamas, Health Education Council, and Employer's Confederation.

A Rotarian since 1980, Rassin has served Rotary as director and is vice chair of The Rotary Foundation Board of Trustees. He was an RI training leader and the aide to 2015-16 RI President K.R. Ravindran.

Rassin received Rotary's highest honor, the Service Above Self Award, as well as other humanitarian awards for his work leading Rotary's relief efforts in Haiti after the 2010 earthquake there. He and his wife, Esther, are Major Donors and Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation.
