MINUTES: DECEMBER 1, 2015

President Sean Priebe presided over the meeting. He thanked Jaclyn Adams for presiding in his absence last week. Thanks to Conrad Welker who gave the invocation and to Bill MacLauchlan who led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Thanks to Ryan Kelly and Jerome Brown who served as our greeters today.

Jaclyn Adams then introduced our visitor. Vanessa Hensen is a guest of Jim Prout and will assist him with today's presentation.

Today's Mystery Rotarian was born in Paducah, KY and lived in Indiana and Tennessee before moving to Hattiesburg at age 13. He is the oldest of four children and pursued careers in sports and music before deciding he would be a better concert goer than musician or athlete. He has seen the Rolling Stones, the Eagles, Eric Clapton and Nora Jones to name a few and many of these artists he has seen multiple times. He attend a public university in north Mississippi and went to school with a former governor and a famous author. Today's Mystery Rotarian is Mike Ratliff.

Sean then presented Richard Topp with a Rotary recognition pin for recruiting a new member. Richard sponsored Jim Prout.

Aaron Ladner reminded Rotarians to bring unwrapped Christmas gifts for the next two weeks. The gifts will be given away by Christian Services during their Birthday for Jesus party on December 19th. Volunteers are also needed for that event and signups will begin next week. Toys should be unwrapped and for ages birth to sixteen.

Sean also announced that Amanda Lee is resigning from the club. Her new job involves travel from Tuesday through Friday of each week. She plans to re-join when and if her travel schedule changes.

Sean also reminded members that our December 15th meeting will be hosted on the USM campus by the Business College. We will not have meetings on December 22 and December 29.

Mike Ratliff then introduced today's guest speaker and Rotarian, Jim Prout. Jim is the Executive Director and COO of Christian Services. Jim reported that his parents, Bill and Cookie Prout decided some thirty years ago to leave their professional careers and do something they were both led to do. They founded Christian Services which is a multi-faceted ministry involving churches and other organizations that come together to help those in need, spreading the hope of Christianity.

Christian Services opened first with a *Soup Kitchen* in downtown Hattiesburg. Today the Kitchen serves between 5 and 7 hundred lunches daily. Last year they estimate they prepared and served more than 150,000 lunches. The Kitchen is open Monday through Friday. Although the food is prepared to be a meaningful meal, the focus of the Kitchen is to build relationships.

They expanded into a *Meals on Wheels* program. It first began with meal service provided to inbound members of one church. It has grown over the years and last year the program prepared and delivered more than 78 thousand meals in Forrest and Lamar counties. Jim says the meal delivered by *Meals on Wheels* may be the only daily meal a person gets.

The Birthday Party for Jesus was established to serve children who are sometimes starving for attention and always in need of assistance. In addition to other activities during the party the children leave with a Christmas gift, which may be the only gift they get.

The Loving Hands Ministry is a benevolence program. It provides whatever assistance that can be provided for those in need. The Ministry receives and processes about 150 applications each month and serves about 2,000 people annually.

The Abundant Harvest program began about twelve years ago. Jim says Christian Services receives hundreds of pounds of food that sometimes cannot be prepared for their other feeding programs before it spoils. Therefore, they found a way to send that food to 25 other agencies who use it in their feeding programs. Jim estimates they provided 800,000 pounds of food to those agencies last year.

Liberty Ministries is a program they founded to help men who are suffering with life controlling issues or may be having difficulties caused by a variety of



factors. The goal of the program is to house the men and help them get back on their feet. Right now it provides housing and support services for 40 individuals. It is a one-year program. Another goal of the program is to teach the residents ways they can give back to their communities when they leave *Liberty*.

Thrive is a new money management program designed to teach people ways they can better manage their money. Participants attend two weeks of classes that are taught by community volunteers. Participants learn how to balance their checkbook and how to not spend more money than they have.

Jim says Christian Services has never gone searching for something new to do but is willing to accept whatever challenges come their way. He thanked the United Way of Southeast Mississippi for their continued financial support.


If you are interested in helping, Jim asked that you talk to someone who may not know what Christian Services is doing. He says you never know who you may help by spreading information about their many programs. He is also looking for volunteers to deliver one Meals on Wheels route. If five people volunteered they

each would only have to spend one hour a week delivering. Another way to help would be to host a food drive. Set up a box at work or at church and ask for food items. Servers are also needed daily in the Soup Kitchen and will also be needed to assist with the Birthday Party for Jesus.
