MINUTES: JANUARY 26, 2016

Sean Priebe then introduced today's guest speaker, Ryan Kelly. Ryan is the founder and CEO of Horizon Professional Services, a management company

Ryan noted that one of the many services provided by his firm is to help with team building. Each member on a team has a specific personality. Those personality traits can assist in better understanding and communication when they are known and recognized.

In addition to understanding individual team member personalities, you must also define what a team is, what is MY team and then identify WHO is on your team. Within each team there is a leader. It may not be the boss or a supervisor. It may actually be a team member with the ability to influence other team members for goal accomplishment. Empowering those "leaders" will lead to team success.

Understanding that knowing your personality type can be helpful in understanding how you react to certain situations and what you may need for improvement. Ryan then led Rotarians through a personality profile exercise which helped individuals understand how they might react in certain situations. He equated the three types of profiles as a lion, a fox or a St. Bernard. Ryan noted that humans do not react with only one type of personality to each situation but often react with a combination of each personality type.
