He is often characterized as a mix of politician, a preacher, and a weather man. He and his wife have two children and are members of Temple Baptist Church. He sees clearly how strangely God designed his life with his best interests in mind. Our Mystery Rotarian is Ryan Kellv.

Ryan Kelly introduced Samantha McCain as our guest speaker. She has lived in the Hub City since 2005. After graduating from Southern Miss with two degrees, she spent time working with Red Cross, Hattiesburg Clinic and The Focus Group. She now serves as the communications director for the Children's Center for Communication and Development at USM.

Samantha informed Rotarians about Social Media: methods, effectiveness and best practices. Some important points were how to determine social boundaries, what to post, when to post, and how to determine how to best reach your customer base. Facebook is still the #1 social media site. In 2015, a group of millennials surveyed indicated that 53% would rather lose their sense of smell than their ability to use technology.

Three important ways to use social media:

- ✓ share good news
- ✓ be a resource for your industry.

Communication on social media is no longer Business to Business (B2B) or Business to Consumer (B2C), it's Human to Human (H2H).

Sean thanked Samantha for her presentation. There was not enough time for Samantha to answer all questions asked and Sean indicated that she would be invited back for a future presentation to the group.

Second Chance Mississippi

Dickie Scruggs is a former lawyer and Navy fighter pilot. He is best known as the architect of the litigation that resulted in the multi-billion dollar Tobacco Settlement, and for later going to federal prison in a judicial bribery scandal. In prison Dickie taught GED to other inmates. That experience led him upon his release to establish Second Chance Mississippi, which is a non-profit collaborative effort with Mississippi's Community Colleges to raise awareness and funds for GED and adult education.

Dickie is a native Mississippian and Ole Miss graduate. He and his wife Diane have been married 44 years, and moved to Oxford from the Coast in 2003. The Scruggs's have two grown children and three grandchildren, and they are members of the First Presbyterian Church.
