

MINUTES FROM 8/4/2009

President Mary Cromartie presided over the meeting.

A.D. Hunt gave the invocation. Mickey Allen led the club in the Pledge of Allegiance. Mary then led members in the Rotary Four Way Test.

Gene Owens recognized today's visitors. Lance Nail had as his guests today Shannon Woodard and Jasmine Allen.

Thanks also for today's Greeters, Stanley Carpenter and Bill Hughes.

Jaclyn Adams reported that the Social Committee has set the tentative date of October 2, 2009 for the Club's first wine tasting fund raiser event. The event will begin at 7:00 p.m. and will be held at Mary Cromartie's home. Tickets are \$40 per person or \$75 per couple. More details will follow.

Robert Cummings announced that the golf tournament date has been set for October 30, 2009. The tournament will be played at Shadowridge and will begin at 12:30 p.m. This year's tournament will not be held in conjunction with the Sunrise Club. Robert reminded members that they will need to increase their efforts of developing sponsors and teams.

David Owens gave today's classification talk. David is a graduate of Hattiesburg High. He attended two years at Mississippi State University and then returned home to the University of Southern Mississippi where he graduated in 2005 with a degree in speech communication. He now works for Owens Business Machines in outside sales. His hobbies include fishing and hunting and anything else outdoors.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Mike Ratliff then introduced today's guest speaker, Sergeant Synarus Green, Public Information Officer for the Hattiesburg Police Department.

Sergeant Green reported that the department was expecting an "up-tick" in crime as the economic situation worsened. However, that expected increase wasn't as prevalent as anticipated. There was a 13% decrease in crime in 2008 when compared to 2007. The decrease going into the summer months was 16% below that of 2008 however, the rate is now down only 7% from last year.

A new field training officer program will be concluding in the near future. When the graduates take to the street the department will employ 128 officers. The City Council has allowed a full force of 440 however, only 128 are currently funded. The detective force is fully staffed at this time.

The department is currently investigating our third homicide for the year. Sergeant Green reports that arrests have been made in all three of those cases. The department has confiscated more than 2,000 pounds of marijuana, 12 pounds of cocaine and approximately \$50,000 in currency during the past six months.

Sergeant Green estimates that 90% of all crimes in the Hattiesburg area are related to either drug use or gang activity. He also notes that crimes are being conducted by younger aged citizens and that these crimes tend to be more violent. Efforts are being promoted to classify gang crimes and "anti-social activity" which will create stiffer penalties for these actions.

The department was involved in a Youth Summer Camp this year. That project is a part of the overall focus on community relations and youth activities. Efforts are underway to create a Police Athletic League for next year.
