# **MINUTES: JULY 29, 2014**

President Wes Brooks presided over the meeting. Thanks to Kristy Gould who gave the invocation and to Sean Priebe who led the club in the Pledge of Allegiance. Thanks to Kemi Simmons for serving as our greeter today.

Aaron Ladner welcomed guests. Paula Brahan is a guest of Erin Granberry. Lucy Parkman's guests were, Sharon Miles, Mike Dixon, Toby Barker and Sharon Willis. Lamar Evans's guest is Toni Lee, his secretary. Faye Gilbert is a returning guest and is transferring her membership to our club. Wes Brooks welcomed back Larry LaBlanc, who has been away due to health issues.

Tracy Fowler reminded everyone that we have three weeks left to purchase tickets for the Home Sweet Home raffle. Anyone who purchased tickets today, gets their name added into the drawing for a fishing excursion.

Paula Brahan received her red badge and new membership packet, announcing that Milam Cotton was her inspiration to join the Rotary Club.

Sharon Miles was presented the Bill Gwen Non-Rotarian of the year award for her service to the community. She runs the Neighbors at Hawkins Elementary and encouraged Rotarians to continue their service to the community and to encourage others to get more involved in their public school system.

Wes Brooks then introduced today's guest speaker, Honorable Robert S. Helfrich, J.D., a Circuit Court Judge for Forrest and Perry Counties. Judge Helfrich presides over the drug court program every Monday and Thursday. There are currently around 275 people in the drug court program, and it is very rewarding to see the transformation of so many lives.

In addition to the drug court program, Judge Helfrich is involved in the Veteran Treatment Court Program. Troops returning from the war fronts today find themselves on the front lines today and back home the next day with little or no time to decompress. With PTSD on the rise, we are seeing more of our service men and women committing suicide than are killed in battle. We are seeing more and more of our service men in the court systems. Every Monday, there will be somebody to sit down and help with the needs of our service men and women in this new program.

In April, the Justice Summit- Department of Justice Drug Court, partnered with the University of Mississippi's Psychology department. Only the non-violent individuals will be evaluated before their first appearance, so the judge will have a better understanding of what program if any, would help them the best. The goal is to rehabilitate, train, teach skills and slowly reintegrate back into society. The Forrest/Perry county drug court is one of three locations chosen for this pilot program in America.

According to the Analysis of Research and Knowledge, the average cost per person to attend the drug court program is \$1,200/ year. The cost per person is \$17,000/year in prison. Thirty percent of the individuals who attend the drug court program will graduate and reenter society. The national prison recidivism rate is 67-72 percent.

And here is a little tidbit of information; Marijuana is considered a gateway drug and is 30 percent stronger today than it was twenty years ago. The

IQ of young, regular users of marijuana is reduced by 8 points.

Wes made the announcement to keep Elizabeth Gillentine in our prayers. She fell from a horse and injured her back.

Wes Brooks adjourned the meeting at 12:59 pm.
