They offer FREE after school classes in creative movement, music, theatre games and a variety of visual art mediums. The classes will meet every Thursday and Friday from 3:30-5:30 beginning September 10th and following the school year calendar. With trinkets and feathers, glue and scissors, the children will kick off the season decorating hats in preparation for a fall Hat Parade in celebration of Hattiesburg Arts Council's 45th anniversary.

Throughout the year participants will be exposed to a variety of art disciplines, they will learn new songs, meet local artists, dancers and musicians, compose plays, creatively express themselves and participate in extended projects.

The group is accepting donations which can range from donating money, supplies and stuff that you may be throwing away at home or in your office. Items such as, computer parts, fabric, signage and just about anything you can think of. The kids love taking things apart and making sculptures, paintings and art out of all kinds of materials. All donations are tax exempt.
