

MINUTES FROM 12/06/11

President Robert Cummings, Jr. presided over the meeting.

Thanks to Jaclyn Adams, who gave the invocation, and to Gene Owens, who led the Club in the Pledge of Allegiance. Robert then led members in the Four Way Test. Thanks to today's greeters Wes Brooks and Chris Price.

Sean Priebe introduced today's visiting Rotarian and visitor. Scott Stover is visiting from the Petal Club. Rusty Edwards is a guest of Mike Ratliff.

Robert announced the winners of last week's election and congratulated the Rotarian leaders for the coming year.

Robert circulated the sign-up sheet for the Salvation Army's bell ringing. A few empty slots remain to be filled. Anyone interested who hasn't signed up should contact Richard Topp.

Robert then called Stan Causey and Mike Ratliff forward for Stan's induction into Rotary membership. Stan is sponsored by Mike Ratliff. He is a USM graduate with a degree in economics. He is married and he and his wife have three children. Stan has already signed up to be a Salvation Army bell ringer.

PROGRAM SUMMARY

Patrick Ward then introduced today's guest speaker, Larry Doleac. Larry is the volunteer director of the Hattiesburg Dixie Youth Baseball program.

According to Larry Hattiesburg area youth began playing organized baseball in the early 1950's. They played Little League baseball until 1955 when the Little Boys Baseball program was formed. That program evolved into what we know today as Dixie Youth Baseball. Dixie Youth is the third largest organized youth baseball program in the nation with more than 300,000 kids participating in 11 southeastern states.

In 1989 the Hattiesburg Dixie Youth program hosted the Dixie Youth World Series. At the time the program was operating in Jaycee Park. There were concerns over the safety of the children playing at Jaycee. In fact three children were hit by automobiles in a ten year span. The push to begin the development of a new facility in a different location began in 1998.

The City Council agreed to donate land at Tatum Park to the program but was unable to assist financially with the facility development. Through grants, fund raising efforts and creative marketing the group generated \$400,000 within a few months and began construction. Fundraising continued. More than \$1.3 was raised and just over \$200,000 of in-kind donations were received and five-field complex became a reality.

In 2010 Dixie Youth raised money and began the development of 4 new practice fields. Both Forrest County and the City of Hattiesburg have participated in the project which has raised about \$120,000. The next goal is to light those four fields which will cost approximately \$165,000.


Hattiesburg Dixie Youth now plays about 700 children aged 4 – 12 each year. The majority of those children come from Forrest County.
