Lee declared official nominee for 2008-09 RI president

On 1 December 2006, RI President William B. Bovd declared Dong Kurn Lee to be the official nominee for president of Rotary Internation al for 2008-09. Lee is a Rotary Foundation trustee and a member of the **Rotary Club** of Seoul Hangang,

Seoul, Korea. His formal election will take place at the <u>2007 Salt Lake City Convention</u>.

Lee is chair of the Bubang Co. Ltd. and Bubang Techron Co. Ltd. manufacturing companies in Seoul and formerly served as a trustee of the Bank of Seoul. In 2005, he was appointed an international goodwill ambassador by the president of Korea.

Lee has also served as honorary consul to the Italian consulate in Korea since 1994 and was awarded the Order of Industrial Merit by the Korean government. He and his wife, Young Ja, have two sons and two daughters.
